In January SIGNS asked the children of Saxilby Church of England Primary School to help us design a logo to use on all our documents and publicity. The Head Teacher Mrs Stratton introduced the idea in the first Collective Worship of the term, which was attended by two members of the SIGNS Organising Group who told the children a little of what the Good Neighbours Scheme would be doing in Saxilby.

The children spent time that day, in their classrooms, creating their designs, helped by their teachers to consider how colour and different fonts affect people's perceptions. Over 300 designs were given to the SIGNS Organising Group, who had a difficult job in choosing eight designs to put on display at our Afternoon Tea event in February. The people there had the opportunity to vote on the design they thought was most suitable. There were two joint winners and their designs were combined to create our new colourful logo.
